

## Style Sheet ASSR Working Papers Series

**In order to have some uniformity in the ASSR working paper series, please follow these minimal style guidelines. If in doubt, have a look at the first Working paper at <http://www2.fmg.uva.nl/assr/workingpapers/documents/ASSR-WP0301.pdf> or contact the editors at [assrworkingpapers@fmg.uva.nl](mailto:assrworkingpapers@fmg.uva.nl)**

1. The cover page, which is in the ASSR house-style, contains the title of the paper, the name(s) of the author(s), their contact details and the ASSR WPS number, which you will receive from the editors.

2. The papers should be written in British English.

3. Font: Times New Roman, size 12.

4. Line Spacing text: 1,5

5. Paragraph Alignment: Justified.

6. Subtitles: the following style should be followed:

**1. SUBTITLE AT FIRST LEVEL**

**1.1. Subtitle at second level**

**1.1.1. *Subtitle at third level***

It is advisable not to use more than three levels of subtitles.

7. Notes are written as footnotes, not as endnotes. Line spacing footnotes: 1.

8. Punctuation: use a single space after a full point, commas, colons, etc. Do not put a space in front of a question mark.

9. References are made according to the American Sociological Review reference style (which can be found in Endnote). Please follow the following style:
